Our Ladies Senior C Coxed Four finished second in the Championship and qualified to represent the West of England at the South Coast Championships held at Dorney Lake, the London 2012 Olympic 2000m course.

To row you need good 'kinaesthetic co-ordination' - you know, where your limbs are in relation to your body!
